Leave was granted to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Wootton, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act to close certain streets within the district of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, in the City of Baltimore.

Mr. Osborne, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Tidy's Island Company, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendments.

Which were read and assented to.

After the name of "Thomas Culbreth," in the third line of the 1st section, insert the words "at a place called the Beaver pond"

In the last two lines of the third section, strike out the words "intend to effectuate," and insert the words "be intended to effectuate."

The bill was then read the second and by special order the third time and passed.
