Ordered, That the committee on Finance, be instructed to inquire into the expediency of establishing a Loan Office in the city of Baltimore, for the stock of this state, with a view to the convenience of transfers of said stock and paying the interest thereon. also, that the committee inquire into the expediency of authorising the treasurer when he shall be applied to for the purpose of noting upon certificates of stock the amount in any foreign denominations of money corresponding, at par, to the amount in dollars and cents, for which such certificates shall be issued respectively.
