Which was read and referred to the consideration of

the house of delegates.

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to make public a certain road in Baltimore county, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to pass

It was read the second and by special order the third time, rejected and returned to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the

following bills:

A bill entitled, an act to prohibit justices of the peace from exercising their magisterial duties in tar rooms, or taverns, or other public houses of that character, so far as relates to Baltimore county.

Which was read the first time and referred to the

committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to allow Thomas W. Morgan, late collector of Saint Mary's county, further time to complete his collections, and for other purposes.

Which was read the first time and referred to the

committee on finance.

A bill entitled, an act to provide for the opening and extension of Curran s Alley in the city of Baltimore.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Morris, Mayer and Claude,

A bill entitled, an act to divorce Anne Maria Robinson of Talbot county from her husband Robert Robinson.

Which was read the first time and referred to the

committee on divorces.

A bill entitled, an act to suspend for a limited time all proceedings under an act of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at December session 1833.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Pigman, Forrest and Claude.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Harmony Beneficial Society of Baltimore.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs.

Morris, Mayer and Hughlett.
