

MONDAY, January 19th, 1835.

The senate met. Present the same senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

The President announced his determination to retire from the chair at the close of the session of this day, and tendered to the senate his thanks for the kind support he had received in the discharge of its duties.
