

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to the committee on judicial proceedings, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the despatch of business in Baltimore County court.

The President announced the orders of the day, being the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Baltimore

It was read the second, and by special order, the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Pigman, leave was granted to the committee on invalid deeds, and defective proceedings, to prepare and report a bill, to be entitled, An act, to make valid a deed from Nancy Beall, Thomas Ward Beall, and Eliza Beall, his wife, to Michael C. Sprigg.

On motion of Mr. Mayer, the following order was read and adopted:

Ordered, That the Senate now proceed to the election of a Director, on the part of the State, in the Bank of Baltimore.

Accordingly the Senate proceeded to said election.

Mr. Mayer nominated George C. Morton.

The ballot box was prepared and the ballots deposited therein.

It was sealed up and delivered to Messrs Mayer, and Sappington, who were appointed by the President, to count the ballots and report the result.

They retired and after a time returned and reported that there were 10 votes given, all of which were for George C. Morton.

Whereupon it was declared that George C. Morton, Esq. is duly elected a Director, on the part of the State, in the Bank of Baltimore, for and during the present year.
