It was read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, An act, to confirm an act, to alter and repeal all such parts of the constitution and form of government, as relates to the division of Frederick county, into twelve election districts, and for other purposes, passed December session, 1331, chapter 112, with the amendments heretofore proposed, were taken up for consideration.

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

The following amendment was read and assented to:
At the end of the bill add the words, "to persons respectively entitled thereto."

The bill was then read throughout the third time, and

passed.

On motion of Mr. Emory, the bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act authorising gates to be kept on the public roads in Queen Anne's courty, passed at December session 1824, chapter 167, was read the third time by special order and passed.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered resolutions relative to the payment of the expenses of the engineer and commissioners in making a survey be-

tween Cape Charles and Lewis Town.

Which were read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.
