And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, an act, authorising officers of the Army or Navv of the United States, to bring their servants, being slaves, into this state, end used "will pass."

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Mayer, Forrest and Groome, to prepare and report a bill, to be entitled, a further supplement to the act, entitled, An act relating to the importation of passengers.

Mr. Morris appeared in the Senate Chamber and resumed

his seat.

On motion of Mr. Wootten,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Wootton, Claude and Morris, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled. An act, relating to incorporations for manufacturing purposes.

On motion of Mr. Wootton,

The bill, entitled, An act, to repeal an act, passed at December session 1833, chapter 111, with the amendment heretofore reported were recommitted to the committee on colored population.

The President announced the orders of the day—being the bill, entitled, An act, for the benefit of Richard N.

Snowden, and

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Joshua B liams,

of Anne-Arundel county.

The Senate proceeded to the consideration of the bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Richard N. Snowden.

On motion of Mr. Wilson,

The said bill was postponed and made the order of the

day for Wednesday the 12th of February next.

The Senate then proceeded to the consideration of the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Joshua B. Iiams, of Anne-Arundel county.

On motion of Mr. Wilson.

The said bill was postponed and made the order of the day

for Wednesday the 12th of Fernary next.

Mr. Forrest from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to make valid the partition of certain real estate lying in Frederick county, in conformity with the provisions of a certain deed made and executed by, and between Henry Clagett and Julia Clagett his wife, of the one part, and Grafton Duvall and Elizabeth W. Duvall his wife, of the other part, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of June, in the year of our Lord 1821, and recorded in Liber I. S. No. 13, folio 545 and 6, one of the land records of Frederick county aforesaid, reported favorably thoreon.
