

In the 28th line of the same section, after the word "for," insert the words "And the said Treasurer is hereby authorised to pay to his order."

At the end of the 1st section add "except such as are herein before provided."

The bill was then read through, and on motion of Mr. Morris the following amendment was read.

At the end of the bill add,

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, that the capital and effects of any bank, undertaking to perform the duties by this act required, shall be and remain responsible to the state, for their full and faithful performance; and that the consent of the stockholders of such bank, in general meeting, to the provisions hereof, shall be had and certified by the president and directors to the governor and council, before the treasurer of the Western Shore or the commissioner of loans shall act in pursuance of them.

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

The said bill and amendment were ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Morris,

They were again taken up for consideration, and on the further motion of Mr. Morris, made the order of the day for to-morrow. (Friday, the 30th inst.)

The bill entitled, A further supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish a bank in the city of Baltimore, to be called the City Bank of Baltimore, and an act entitled a supplement to an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road leading to Cumberland, and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes, was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Mayer, from the committee to which was referred the memorial of Stephen Rossel, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of the education fund of the Baltimore annual conference, which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to the committee on judicial proceedings to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, an act directing the manner of suing out attachments in this province, and limiting the extent of them.
