The senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

Mr. Forrest from the committee to which was referred the memorial of George Winchester and Maria his wife, reported a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the distribution of a certain real estate, in the city of Baltimore by lot.

Which was read the first time.

On motion of Mr. Forrest,

The committee appointed to visit St. John's College, was enlarged and made to consist of Messrs. Forrest, Mayer, Hughlett, Morris and Claude.

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Pigman, Page and Mayer, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, An act, supplementary to an act, to incorporate the American Life Insurance and Trust Company.

Mr. Morris presented the petition of Andrew and John Ellicott, for a law to transfer to them a portion of Balderston street, in consideration of their allowing the extension of Ellicott street, to Balderston street:

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Page.

On motion of Mr. Montgomery,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Montgomery, Mayer and Forrest, to prepare and report a bill, to be entitled, An act relating to the trial of Ejectment causes in this state.

Mr. Montgomery from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill, entitled, An act, relating to the trial of Ejectment causes in this state.

Which was read the first time.

The President announced the order of the day—the bill, entitled, An act to establish a commissioner of loans.
