

MONDAY, February 2d, 1835.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Pigman, from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, An act supplementary to the act entitled an act to incorporate the American Life Insurance and Trust Company,

Which was read the first time.

The bill entitled, A further additional supplement to the act entitled an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers,

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Sappington,

The memorial of sundry citizens of Emmitsburg, praying the suppression of the Lottery System within this state, was taken up for consideration, and

On the further motion of Mr. Sappington,

It was referred to Messrs. Sappington, Page, and Wilson.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution in favour of James Raymond,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on finance.

Also a bill entitled, An act to authorise certain commissioners of Prince George's county to alter and change a part of a public road lying within the land of George Calvert, in said county,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Wooton, Claude and Sappington.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas B. Waterman, endorsed "will pass."

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.
