

Mr. Morris, from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of the Trustees of St. Paul's Chapel Free School Fund of Charles county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, and assented to.

Mr. Groome, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, an act empowering and directing the commissioners of Cecil county to build two fire-proof offices for the use of the clerk and register of wills of said county, for the safe keeping of the records appertaining to their respective offices in the town of Elkton, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Groome,

The bill entitled, A further additional supplement to an act entitled an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers,

Was read the third time by special order, and passed.

Mr. Morris, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled an act supplementary to an act for opening Bottle Alley, in the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion that it ought to pass, with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

After the word "provided," in the 2d line of the 11th section, insert the words "or if this act shall not be approved of by the mayor and city council of Baltimore,

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed.

Mr. Morris, from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Chair-makers' Beneficial Society of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Pigman presented the petition of Samuel I. Delissa, for a special act of insolvency,

Which was read and referred to the committee on insolvency.
