

WEDNESDAY, February 4th, 1835.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The report of the trustees of the Academy at Easton, referred yesterday by the Senate to the consideration of the House of Delegates, and

The bill entitled, A further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, passed by the Senate on yesterday, were sent, and

The resolution in favour of the trustees of St. Paul's Chapel Free School of Charles county, assented to by the Senate on yesterday, and

The bill entitled, An act to provide for building a Court House in Worcester county;

The bill entitled, A further supplement to an act entitled, an act empowering and directing the commissioners of Cecil county to build two fire-proof offices for the use of the clerk and register of wills of said county, for the safe keeping of the records appertaining to their respective offices, in the town of Elkton, severally passed by the Senate on yesterday, and

The bill entitled, A further supplement to an act entitled, an act supplementary to an act entitled, an act for opening of Bottle Alley in the city of Baltimore, also passed by the Senate on yesterday, with an amendment, were returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Pigman, from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the petition of William Motter and John Motter, reported a bill entitled, An act to make valid a certain deed from Bene S. Pigman to Henry Motter, bearing date the 12th day of June, 1824, and recorded in Liber I I. ch. 20, folios 226, &c one of the land records of Frederick county,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

Read the third time by special order, passed, and sent to the House of Delegates.
