

At the end of the first section as proposed to be amended add, "nor in any manner concerned in the manufacture of flour."

In the sixth line of the 2nd section. strike out the word "one" and insert the word "two."

In the 17th line of the 2nd section before the word "debts," insert the word "sperate."

On motion of Mr. Wootton,

In the 29th line of the 4th section, strike out the words "said company," and insert the words "any stockholder said stockholder"

The following amendment was read and dissented from.

Add between 6th and 7th sections, "And be it enacted, that for all debts which shall be due and owing by the company at the time of its dissolution, the persons then composing such company shall be individually responsible to the extent of their respective shares of stock in said company, and no further."

On motion of Mr. Morris,

The following amendment was read and assented to.

In the 1st line of the 8th section after the word "stockholders" insert the words "except such as shall have withdrawn as hereinbefore provided."

Mr. Page moved to strike out the 11th section of the bill.

The question was put, and determined in the negative.

"Shall the bill pass?"
