A bill, entitled, An act, for the incorporation of Caroline Lodge, No 22 of the order of Independent Odd Fellows, in Caroline county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Osborn, Mayer and Groome.

A bill, entitled, An act, to alter and change the name of the Hagerstown Female Society, for the instruction of poor children.

A bill, entitled, An act, extending the time for completing the Turnpike Road, from Boonsborough in Washington county, to the Potomac River, and for other purposes.
