

On motion of Mr. Morris,  
The first section of the bill was reconsidered.

On motion of Mr. Wootton,  
The words "or charged," in the last line of the 1st section, were stricken out.

On motion of Mr. Claude,  
The words "to any individual," in the same line and same section, were stricken out.

On motion of Mr. Morris,  
The following amendment was read and assented to:  
Add, at the end of the first section,  
'And except, to be reimbursed, the actual cost of the books, stationary, and printing expences that shall be found necessary in the performance of the duties herein assigned to the commissioner of loans.'

On motion of Mr. Morris,  
The second section was reconsidered, and  
On the further motion of Mr. Morris,  
The following amendment was read and assented to:  
Insert, after the word "thereof" in the 5th line of the 2d section, "or to create with the fraudulent intent of putting into circulation any other than a certificate, bona fide authorized."
