FRIDAY, February 6th, 1835.

The senate met. Present the same senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill entitled, An act to incorporate the Chairmaker's Beneficial Society of Baltimore, passed by the Senate on yesterday, and

The bill entitled, An act to locate and open a new road in Allegany county, and for other purposes, also passed by the Senate on yesterday, with certain amendments,

Were returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Morris,

The bill entitled, An act to allow further time to Matthias Dashiell, late sheriff and collector of Somerset county, to complete his collections,

Was reconsidered; and the question put,

"Shall the bill pass?" and

It was determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Morris submitted the following message,

Which was read and adopted, and with the bill, sent to the House of Delegates:

By the Senate,

Feb. 6th, 1835.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message, requesting us to reconsider and recede from the amendment to the bill, entitled, "An act to allow further time to Matthias Dashiell, late sheriff and collector of Somerset county, to complete his collections;" and, in compliance with the request, have reconsidered the same, and take leave respectfully to point out to your honourable body the proviso to an act of 1831, chap. 141. as a precedent in point to justify the amendment in question.
