Which amendment was read the first time, and was as follows:

In the 5th line, 1st section, after the word "court" insert "from any fact or facts in the case verified by affidavit."

Mr. Wilson submitted the following message;

Which was read and adopted.

By the Senate, February 10th, 1835.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates,

We have received your message proposing to proceed to the election of bank directors this day at 11 o'clock, and concur therein. We make no addition to the nomination of your Honorable body. We have appointed Messra. Wilson and Montgomery, to join the gentlemen named in your message, to count the ballots and report the result.

By order, Jos. H. Nicholson, Clk

Mr. Wootton from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to authorise certain commissioners of Prince Georges county, to alter and change a part of a public road lying within the lands of George Calvert, in said county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third

time passed and returned to the house of Delegates.

Mr. Forrest presented the petition of William O'Neale

jr. late sheriff of Montgomery county

Which was read and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

The hour having arrived, the senate proceeded to the

election of bank directors.

On motion of Mr. Morris,

The senate excused him from voting for directors for

the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore.

The ballot box was then prepared and the ballots deposited therein. It was sealed up and delivered to Messrs. Wilson and Montgomery, who were appointed by the sentate, to join the committee of the house of delegates, to count the ballots and report the result. They retired, and after a time returned and reported, there had been 80 votes given in all.—Of which for the Mechanics Bank of Baltimore, Francis Neal had 65 votes, Edenezer L. Finley 33 votes, and John W. Smith 50 votes. For the Farmers Bank of Maryland, Nicholas Brewer jr. had 60 votes, George Wells 60 votes, and Benjamin L. Gantt 72 votes.
