The bill, entitled, An act, to make valid a deed from Nancy Beall, Thomas Ward Beall, and Eliza Beall, his wife, to Michael C. Sprigg.

Was read the third time, by special order, passed,

and sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Morris,

The bill, entitled, a supplement to an act, for the establishment of vestries for each parish in this State,

Was read the second time by special order, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Morris,

Read the third time, by special order, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Pigman,

Leave was granted to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, An act to make valid a deed from Peter Briley, of Dorchester county, to James Briley.

THURSDAY, February 12th, 1835.

The senate met. Present the same Senators as on yesterday The proceedings of yesterday were read.

the use of the General Assembly.

The special committee to whom sundry papers were referred, presented to the Senate in a communication from John Hoye and Meshach Frost, commissioners appointed by law to examine that part of the Cumberland Road, within the limits of this State, have had the same under consideration, and respectfully report,

That as the final determination of this State, upon the matters growing out of the communication and papers under consideration, will be connected in some degree with the commencement of the road at Cumberland, by the Federal Government, the committee have deemed
