The amendment proposed by the House of Delegates to the bill, which originated in the Senate, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act, for the relief of the securities of the collectors of taxes, and of sheriffs, passed at December session 1831, chapter 282,

Was read and adopted.

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, An act, to authorise the recording of certain deeds of manumission,
