In the 9th, and 10th lines of the 2d section, strike out the words "after deducting therefrom the amount of all mortgages, judgments, and other liens upon the same."

Mr. Claude moved to strike out the 2d section. The

question was put, and

Determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Forrest moved to recommit the bill to the committee on divorces, with instructions so to amend it as to make it a divorce a mensa et thoro. The question was put, and

Determined in the negative. On motion of Mr. Forrest,

The bill was then ordered to lie on the table.
