

Mr. Morris presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Baltimore, praying that the bill for widening and extending Run Alley, may not pass,

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Morris, Mayer and Montgomery.

The bill, entitled, An act, to divorce Sarah Mitchell, of Calvert county, from her husband Samuel Mitchell,

Was read the third time.

On motion of Mr Groome,

The following amendment was read and adopted.

At the end of the bill add:

“And be it enacted, That the said Sarah Mitchell, be and she is hereby authorised to resume, take, use and be known by her maiden name of Howes.”

The bill was then passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Mayer, Morris and Montgomery, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a supplement to the act, entitled, An act, relating to streets in the city and precincts of Baltimore.

Mr. Claude from the committee on insolvency to which was referred the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Bayly Keys, of the city of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to the committee on judicial proceedings to prepare and report a bill, to be entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act, to regulate the proceedings in Baltimore county court, passed at December session 1833, chapter 202.

On motion of Mr. Forrest,

The bill entitled, An act to authorise the distribution of certain real estate in the city of Baltimore by lot,

Was being read the second time, when

On motion of Mr. Wootton,

The preamble was amended by striking out all of it after the word “eighteen.”

On motion of Mr. Forrest,

The following amendments were read and assented to.

In the 3d line of the 2nd section after the word “some” insert the words “on oath.”

In the 1st line of the 3d section after the word “scheme” insert the words “of the lottery.”
