The Senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock

MONDAY, February 16th, 1835.

The Senate met. Present the same Senators as on Saturday. The proceedings of Saturday were read.

Mr. Sappington from the committee to which was referred the memorial of sundry citizens of Frederick, reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Mechanics Institute and Frederick Lyceum.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

It was accordingly engrossed, and On motion of Mr. Sappington,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent

to the house of delegates.

Mr. Sappington from the committee on the library, to which was referred the resolution in favor of the clerk of the senate, and the clerk of the house of delegates, reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to be assented to, with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

After the word "being," insert the words "the Mayor of the city of Annapolis, the Principal of St. John's College, the Chaplains of the senate and house of delegates, and all persons who have been members of either branch of the General Assembly, while at the seat of government."

The resolution was then read the second and by special order the third time, assented to, and returned to

the house of delegates.

Mr. Montgomery from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to appoint Mary Jerdan, of Harford county, trustee of certain land therein mentioned, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.
