act to authorise the opening and extension of East Street, in the city of Annapolis, and to close up the street now

leading from East to Prince George street.

Mr. Claude, from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, An act to authorise the opening and extension of East street, in the city of Annapolis, and to close up the street leading from East to Prince George street,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third read-

ing.

The bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to insolvent debtors in the city and county of Baltimore,

Was being read the second time, when,

On motion of Mr. Forrest,

The following amendments were read and assented to:

At the end of the 2d section, add,

Provided, that nothing herein contained shall, in any manner, discharge the property so acquired or accrued, from any execution or attachment levied thereon previously to the passage of this act, but that the said process shall, in all respects, be valid and effectual to the same extent, as if the said insolvent debtor had not made his said application."

After the word "attachment," in the 2d line of the 3d section, strike out the words "that shall issue against," and insert, "or other proceeding at law, or in equity, now or hereafter to be instituted, for the purpose of making

liable."

At the end of the 3d section, add,

"And the creditor or creditors, at whose instance such attachment or other proceeding at law or in equity shall have been instituted, shall be at liberty to give in evidence under the general issue, any debt, claim, or demand, due to him, her, or them, by the said insolvent debtor, at the time of his said application."

The bill was then read through, and,

On motion of Mr. Forrest,

The following amendment was read and assented to:

At the end of the bill add the following:

"Sec. 8. And be it enacted, That no attachment which shall have issued against any property so acquired or accrued as aforesaid by any non resident debtor or debtors, shall be dissolved unless the defendant or defendants there-
