in, or some person for such defendant or defendants, shall enter into bond with good security to be approved by the court to satisfy any judgment that shall be recovered in such case against said defendant or defendants."

On motion of Mr. Groome,

The bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the House of Delegates delivered a resolution requesting the Executive to have a guard stationed to protect the public property.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs

Claude, Sappington and Morris.

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to define and enlarge the powers of Courts of Equity,

Was read the second time, and

On motion of Mr. Groome, Ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

Leave was granted to the committee on judicial proceedings to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act relating to justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore.

Mr. Claude from the committee to which was referred the resolution requesting the Executive to have a guard stationed to protect the public property, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second and by special order the third time and assented to.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill entitled, an act to make valid a certain writ and to confirm certain proceedings therein mentioned,

Was reconsidered and ordered to lie on the table.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, February 18th, 1835.

The senate met. Present the same senators as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The resolution requesting the Executive to have a guard stationed, to protect the public property, assented to by the Senate on yesterday, was returned to the House of Delegates.
