Which was read and assented to:

In the 6th line of the bill, strike out the words "and returning from."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order

the third time, and passed.

The clerk of the House of Delegates returned the fol-

lowing bills:

A bill entitled a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the election of Commissioners for Washington county, and prescribing their powers and duties,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs.

Sappington, Forrest and Hughlett.

A bill entitled, An act for the relief of Thomas Perry, late sheriff and collector of Charles county,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the com-

mittee on finance.

A bill entitled, An act to divide Worcester county into school districts, to regulate the distribution of the free school funds of said county, and for the promotion of education therein,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs.

Wilson, Hughlett and Montgomery.

And returned the bill, which originated in the Senate, entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the despatch of business in Baltimore county court, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Morris presented the memorial of sundry Banks of Baltimore, praying that no law may pass chartering another Bank in Baltimore, which shall impair the contract

entered into between said Banks and the State,

Which was read and referred to the committee on finance. The Senate adjourned until to morrow morning 10 o'clock.
