Which was read and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered a resolution for the payment of expenses on account of the Rail Road Riots.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on finance.

Also a bill entitled, an act relative to the selling and removal of negro slaves.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

Mr. Claude from the committee on insolvency to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Robert Roach of the city of Baltimore, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to define and enlarge the powers of courts of equity, was taken up for consideration and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

Mr. Emory presented the petition of the trustees of the poor of Queen Anne's county, relative to rebuilding or purchasing a Poor's House for said county.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Emory, Hughlett and Osborn.

Mr. Emory from the committee on colored population to which was recommitted the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act passed at December session 1833, chap. 111, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the amendment as heretofore reported.

Which amendment was as follows:

In the 8th line of the bill after the word "repealed" add "except so far as the same relates to the counties of the Eastern Shore and,"

The question was put, "Will the Senate assent to said amendment."
