Mr. Emory from the committee to which the petition of the Trustees of the Poor of Queen Anne's county was referred, reported a bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act, entitled, an act for erecting buildings for the use of the Poor in Queen Anne's county and for other purposes, passed at November session 1803.

Which was read the first and by special order the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Emory,

Read the third time by special order, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act, entitled, an act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning Last Wills and Testaments, the duties of Executors, Administrators, and Guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons.
