owning land in any part of this State, or any citizen of the State, owning property within the said District, or hereafter acquiring it, to remove any slave or slaves for life, being natives of this State or that part of said District, and being the property of such citizen, into this state and from this state, back into that part of said District, at the will and pleasure of such owner without any such slave or slaves being thereby entitled to their treedom; any law to the contrary notwithstanding; Provided always, That nothing in this act contained, shall be construed to give power or authority to any citizen of the District of Columbia, to recover any slave or slaves from the said District into this State, which shall have been, or may be brought into the said District, from any of the United States, except this State."

Mr. Morris, from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolutions directing the treasurer of the Western Shore to withdraw the State's Deposites from the Union Bank of Maryland, and to sell the debts due the State by the Bank of Maryland, and apply a portion of the same towards defraying the expenses of the current fiscal year, reported favorably thereon.

They were read the second time, and
