

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Chairmakers Beneficial Society of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Morris and Wootton.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate entitled, an act to incorporate the Mechanics Institute and Frederick Lyceum, endorsed, "will pass" with the proposed amendment,

Which amendment was read and adopted,

And was as follows:

Strike out in the second section, eleventh line, after the word "the," to the end of said section; and insert the following in lieu thereof.

"Total value of the property of said Corporation, real, personal and mixed, shall not exceed the sum of twenty thousand dollars."

Also returned the bill which originated in the Senate entitled, an act to make valid the proceedings therein mentioned, endorsed "will pass" with the proposed amendment.

Which amendment was read and adopted, and was as follows:

Add the following as additional sections,

Section 2. And be it enacted, That before the said William O'Neale, jr. shall proceed to collect money which may be payable to others, or sell property under writs of *feri facias*, or *venditioni exponas*, he shall give bond to the state of Maryland, in the penalty now prescribed for sheriff's bonds by the laws of this state, with security to be approved by Montgomery County court, or in its vacation, by the Orphans court of said county.

Section 3. And be it enacted, That if the said William O'Neale, jr. shall fail to give bond, as is prescribed by the second section of this act, on or before the twentieth day of March, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, then it shall be lawful for the Clerk of Montgomery County court, and he is hereby directed, upon application being made to him, to issue writs of *feri facias*, or *venditioni exponas*, directed to the sheriff, (for the time being) of said county, to be executed by him in the same manner as if no such writs had been issued before.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.
