Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed at December session, 1832, chapter 158, entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Frederick and Baltimore counties.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Morris and Pigman.

A bill entitled, an act to provide for completing a new map and geological survey of the state.

And a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act incorporating a company to make a turnpike road from Clear Spring, in Washington county, to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal.

Which were severally read the first time and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

A bill entitled, a supplement to the act to incorporate the Liberty Copper Company.

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wootton, Pigman and Morris.

A bill entitled, an act authorising the Commissioners of Washington county to erect a stone bridge across the Antietam Creek where the road from Sharpsburgh to the Maple Swamp, crosses said creek.
