

On motion of Mr. Wootton, the following amendment was read and dissented from.

In the 10th line of the 1st section, strike out the word "three" and insert "six."

The bill was then read through and the question put, "Shall the bill pass?"

The bill entitled, an act to repeal all such acts or parts of acts as go to alter the mode of appointment of the justices of the levy courts of the several counties of this state, was read the second time, and

On motion of Mr. Hughlett, the following amendment was read:

Add the following as an additional section:

"And be it enacted, That the operations of this act shall not extend to Talbot county."
