real, personal, and mixed; and upon appearance of such debtor, or refusing after notice to appear, and the commissioners being satisfied of the fact of the imprisonment aforesaid, and if said debtor, still continuing in prison at the time of the action of said commissioners, they shall appoint a trustee, in whom shall vest as aforesaid, by virtue of such appointment, all the property, rights, and estate of said debtor, as fully and effectually as if such trustee were at that time, in the course of an application aforesaid, appointed permanent trustee, of such debtor, under the act to which this is a supplement, or any supplement thereto; and such trustee shall have all the rights, power, and privileges of any such permanent trustee; and shall give bond, with security, as required, of said permanent trustee for the performance of his duty as trustee."
