Gentlemen of the Senate, and
of the House of Delegates:

We herewith submit, for your consideration, a communication from the Hon. Lewis Cass, Secretary of War, with a copy of an act of Congress, passed at its recent session, for the continuation and repair of the Cumberland Road; by which it will be seen, that no part of the sum appropriated by the second section of the said act can be expended in the repair of the said road, east of the river Ohio, until the same shall be received into, and accepted by, the States respectively, through which said road passes.
