On motion of Mr. Hughlett, the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, A supplement to the act to authorise and require the Levy Courts of Somerset and Dorchester counties, respectively to levy annually a sum of money, to be paid to the President and Directors of the Nanticoke Bridge Company, for the privilege, to the residents of said counties, of passing the bridge over the Nanticoke River, at Vienna, without paying toll, passed at December session, 1834, was enlarged, and made to consist of Messrs. Wilson, Page, Hughlett, Morris and Pigman.

Mr. Mayer, from the committee to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, An act to extend the charters of the several Banks in the city of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time

Mr. Hughlett submitted the following message,
