

A bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 138, for the regulation and improvement of the village of Denton, in Caroline county, and for other purposes,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Hughlett, Emory, and Montgomery.

A bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act, to authorise and empower the levy court of Charles county, to assess and levy a sum of money on the assessable property thereof; for the purpose of building a goal in said county, passed at December session 1811 chapter 55,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Wootton, Morris and Groome.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, An act to authorise the distribution of certain real estate, in the city of Baltimore by lot, endorsed, "will pass with the proposed amendment."

Which amendment was read and adopted, and was as follows:

After the word "expired," in the seventh line of the third section, insert the following:

"Unless the lottery commissioners shall be of opinion that the same may be put into operation at an earlier period without injury to the revenue of the state, and shall so certify to the Treasurer of the Western Shore, and thereupon this act shall go into immediate effect and operation."
