The justice, sheriff, and clerk, shall be entitled to receive the same fees, for services rendered under this act, as they are allowed in similar cases: and the persons, summoned as jurors, shall each receive one dollar per day, during their attendance, which fees and allowances shall be paid by said company; and the said company, or their agents, shall have power to remove said materials across any land, not in meadow or grain, upon paying a reasonable compensation to the owner or owners, for any injury in damages, to be ascertained by a jury as above, in case the same cannot be obtained by agreement."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, and passed.

On motion of Mr. Mayer,
