So it was determined in the affirmative, and the bill returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Groome, from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to divorce Mary Anne Roache, of the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second time.

Mr. Groome, from the committee on divorces, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to divorce Isabella P. Baltz, of Baltimore, county, from her husband John Baltz, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass, with the following amendment,

Which was read the first time:

Strike out all after the enacting clause, and insert in lieu thereof, the words

“That the said Isabella P. Baltz be and she is hereby divorced from bed, board, and mutual cohabitation with her husband John Baltz.”

On motion of Mr Wootton,

The bill and amendment were ordered to lie on the table.

On motion of Mr. Forrest,

It was ordered that, in the evening sessions, none but bills which are private, or local in their character, shall be considered.

The bill entitled, An act to divorce Margaret Calahan, of Frederick county, from her husband Patrick Calahan, reported favorably thereon;

They were severally read the second time.
