Also the following bills:

A bill entitled, A supplement to the act passed at December session 1834, chapter 27, appointing commissioners to lay out and open an additional election district in Frederick county, and for other purposes,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Forrest, and Hughlett.

A bill entitled, A further additional supplement to an act to regulate the inspection of lumber, in the city of Baltimore,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Mayer, Morris and Wilson.

A bill entitled, A supplement to an act, entitled, An act to regulate the inspection of Tobacco.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

And returned the bill which originated in the Senate, entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act to provide for electing commissioners for Cecil county, by districts, and prescribing their duties and powers and repealing an act and its supplements therein mentioned, endorsed "will pass."

Mr. Morris from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, An act relating to Run Alley in the city of Baltimore, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment, which was read and assented to.

4th section 6th line, after the word "the" strike out "persons and property," and insert, "property, and the owners thereof, binding on each side of said Alley, as the same shall be widened and extended that shall be."

The bill was then read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.
