

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings.

And returned the bill which originated in the senate, entitled, an act for the distribution of certain real and personal estate, endorsed "will pass."

On motion of Mr. Montgomery,

Leave was granted to Messrs. Montgomery, Mayer and Forrest, to prepare and report a bill to be entitled, an act to authorise the drawing of a Lottery, to purchase a fire apparatus and improve the streets in the Town of Belle-Air, in Harford county,

Mr. Mayer from the committee to which was referred the bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed at December session 1832, chapter 158, entitled, an act to lay out and open a road in Frederick and Baltimore counties, reported favorably thereon;

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Mayer from the committee on judicial proceedings to which was referred the bill entitled, an act to regulate the compensation of jurors, judges of the orphans court, judges of the levy court, commissioners of the tax and witnesses for Caroline county, reported favorably thereon,

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

On motion of Mr. Groome,

The bill entitled, an act for the benefit of William Russell,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading,

It was accordingly engrossed, and

On motion of Mr. Groome,

Read the third time, by special order passed and sent to the house of delegates

Mr. Groome from the committee to which was referred the petition of Ann B. Wilcox, reported a bill entitled, an act to divorce Ann B. Wilcox of Baltimore city, from her husband James Wilcox, of Kent county,

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Groome from the committee on divorces to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to divorce Virginia Williams from her husband Isaac Williams, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass,

It was read the second time.
