Mr. Emory, from the committee on coloured population, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to provide more effectually for the levy and collection of the tax imposed for the purpose of colonizing the free people of color of this state, by the act entitled, An act relating to the people of color in this state, passed at December session, 1831, chapter 281, reported favorably thereon;

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Page, from the committee to which was referred the petition of John H. Harris, and the counter petition of Thomas Bowdle, reported a bill entitled, A supplement to an act to make public a certain road in Talbot county, passed 1799, chapter 28,

Which was read the first, and by special order the second time, and

On motion of Mr. Page,

It was made the order of the day for Wednesday next, the 18th inst.

Mr. Morris, from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of the Dorchester county Academies, reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to be assented to.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, dissented from, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Mayer, from the committee on judicial proceedings, to which the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled, An act relating to the jurisdiction and powers of the justices of the peace for the city of Baltimore;

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Sappington presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Frederick county, relative to the bill appropriating two millions of dollars to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal,

Which was read and referred to the committee on internal improvement.

The clerk of the house of Delegates delivered a resolution in favor of Bridget Duffee,

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on revolutionary claims.
