It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

The bill entitled, An act increasing the width of a part of Light Street, in the city of Baltimore, passed at December session, 1832, chapter 214, was read the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Mayer, from the committee on invalid deeds and defective proceedings, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to make valid a certain deed executed between Edward H. Calvert and Benjamin Oden, of Prince George's county, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Wootton, from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to accept the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled, an act for the continuation and repair of the Cumberland Road, in the states of Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois, reported favorably thereon.

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Wootton, from the committee on internal improvement, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for the completion of the Baltimore and Susquehanna Rail Road to the borough of York, in the state of Pennsylvania, reported that the
