

tion of the death, and the omission to appear after such suggestion, shall apply, and they are hereby extended to the case of a marriage as aforesaid, and a suggestion thereof.

Section 6. And be it enacted, That the provisions of the seventh section of the act of November session, of the year 1785; chapter 46, be, and they are hereby extended to authorise the defendant in any suit, on simple contract, to file in bar, or by way of set off, or upon reasonable notice, to give in evidence, by way of set off, any claim he may have against the plaintiff by specialty or debt of record."

The bill was then read through the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading
