A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of James Corlin, of Frederick county,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Pigman, Wilson and Montgomery.

A bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Wetipquin Academy, in Somerset county,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Wilson, Mayer and Hughlett.

A bill entitled, an act supplementary to an act relative to taking supersedeas, and making valid the same.

A bill entitled, an act to regulate the removal of indictments found in Baltimore City court, and

A bill entitled, an act to repeal the second and third sections of the act of Assembly, of 1715, chapter 31;

Which were severally read the first time, and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

The bill entitled, an act to permit Guardians, Executors and Trustees, to bring slaves into this state from any adjoining state or district, to hire and work, and not for sale:

Was being read the second time, when

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

It was amended as follows:

In the 2nd line of the first section, after the word "trustees," insert the words "residing in this state."

The bill was then read through, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
