It was read the second and by special order the third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Morris from the committee on divorces, to which was recommitted the bill entitled, an act to divorce Zachariah Webster and Mildred his wife, reported that the committee had had said bill again under consideration and were of opinion it ought not to pass;
