

The following amendment was read; and,

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The bill and amendment was ordered to lie on the table.

Strike out all the bill, after the word "that," in the first line, and insert "so much of any law as prohibits the importation of any slave into the state of Maryland from the District of Columbia or the state of Virginia, be and the same is hereby repealed."

And be it enacted, That any person who shall so import a slave, shall pay the tax fixed by the act passed at December session, —, chapter 87."

Mr. Emory, from the committee on coloured population, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to authorise George T. Martin to remove certain slaves into this state, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to pass;

It was read the second, and by special order the third time, rejected, and returned to the House of Delegates.

Mr. Emory, from the committee on coloured population, to which was referred the bill entitled, An act to authorise the clerk of St. Mary's county court to record a deed of manumission therein mentioned, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to pass.

It was read the second time.

The Senate adjourned until to-morrow morning, 10 o'clock.
