Ordered, That the amendments reported by the commit-
tee on internal improvement to the bill entitled, An act to
provide for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio
Canal, to Cumberland, and for the completion of the Bal-
timore and Susquehanna Rail Road, to the Borough of York
in the Stnte of Pennsylvania, should not be entertained in-
asmuch as the senate have no constitutional right to amend
the bill.
