They were severally read the second and by special order the third time dissented from, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, an additional supplement to an act to regulate the issuing of licenses to Traders, Keepers of Ordinaries and others, passed December session 1827, chapter 117, reported favorably thereon,

It was read the second and by special order the third time passed and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to permit guardians, executors and trustees, to bring slaves into this state, from any adjoining state or district, to hire and work and not for sale,

Was read the third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, an act to amend the declaration of rights and constitution and form of government of this state, was being read the second time, when

On motion of Mr. Emory,

The following amendments were read and assented to:

At the end of the 1st section add the words; "after the expiration of existing lottery grants."

In the 7th line of 2nd section, strike out the words "the sale of lotteries being practicably a grant of a monopoly."

On motion of Mr. Mayer,

The consideration of said bill was postponed, and it was made the special order of the day for this afternoon's session.
