

Mr. Morris from the committee on finance, to which was referred the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to facilitate the recovery of debts due from the several banks of this state, and to compel the said banks to pay specie for their notes, or forfeit their charters, passed at December session 1818, chapter 177, reported that the committee had had said bill under consideration, and were of opinion it ought to pass with the following amendment,

Which was read and assented to:

In the 3d line of the proviso at the end of the bill strike out the word "hereafter," and insert "heretofore"

The bill was then read the second time.

On motion of Mr. Wootton,

The bill entitled, an act to provide for completing a new map and geological survey of this state,

Was taken up for consideration,

The amendments heretofore proposed were read and the question put, "Will the Senate assent to said amendments,
