

A bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to abolish the office of trustee of the state, &c., passed at December session 1828, chapter 74.

Which was read the first time and referred to the committee on finance.

A bill entitled, an act to prevent the judges of the county, and orphan's courts, county clerks and registers of wills, from acting as executors, administrators or trustees,

A bill entitled, an act to prohibit the sale of intoxicating liquors upon the Sabbath day.

A bill entitled, an act to prevent the register of wills from charging or receiving any allowance for stating the annual accounts of guardians, except in certain cases,

Which were severally read the first time, and referred to the committee on judicial proceedings.

A bill entitled, an act to repeal the act for the present session of the General Assembly, chapter 35, entitled, an act to authorise certain commissioners to lay off a road from the store of William Dorsey, at Back Creek, in Somerset county, to the county road, at the expense of said Dorsey,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Wilson, Emory and Osborn.

A bill entitled, An additional supplement to an act entitled, An act to lay out and make public a road in Montgomery county, passed at November session, 1816,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Forrest, Wootton and Pigman.

A bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act to incorporate Frederick town, in Frederick county,

Which was read the first time, and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Pigman and Emory.

A bill entitled, An additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the public instruction of youth in primary schools throughout this state, passed at December session, 1825, chapter 161, so far as the same relates to Kent county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Osborn, Emory, and Wootton.

Mr. Morris, from the committee on finance, to which was referred the resolution in favor of John C. Prather, reported that the committee had had said resolution under consideration, and were of opinion it ought not to be assented to.
