Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Hughlett and Wootton.

A bill entitled, A supplement to the act to incorporate Frederick Town, in Frederick county,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Sappington, Wilson and Emory.

A bill entitled, An act making additional provision for the Crier of Harford County court,

Which was read the first time and referred to Messrs. Montgomery, Mayer and Groome.
